Long Line Recall

What is Recall?

Recall is about your dog coming back every time you call, regardless of distractions. As with all commands, you should use your pup's name to get his attention, followed by the command.

Using a long training line in the garden and the park will help you to teach your dog that 'FIDO, COME, means, come back to me.

Your dog learns by building habits. Using a long training line to get 100% success when you call, 'FIDO, COME,' will help you to build that habit.

How?

Long line recall is a way of using your long training line to build the 'FIDO, COME' habit, if you are on your own.

Drop a treat (you might need a couple of small pieces), on the floor under your dog's nose, give him permission to eat it.

While he is eating the treat, jog gently away from your dog, keeping hold of the long line, but making sure not to pull on the lead.

Once your dog has finished eating the treat, call his name, making sure you get his attention before you add in your 'COME' command.

Make yourself exciting to encourage your dog to come to you. Immediately your dog arrives, praise and deliver the treat.

If your dog doesn't respond when you call his name, give the long line a little wiggle to get his attention, make yourself exciting, then add in your COME command.
